SDGs at a glance

What are the SDGs and why are they so important?

L&R has committed itself to the task of actively applying SDGs for its strategic development and would like to work alongside its employees to set an example with regards to sustainability. SDGs offer a range of different approaches for companies to orientate themselves for the future, supporting us over the long-term to develop innovative solutions for our core businesses, and beyond.

The UN's 17 Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) are humanity's most ambitious plan for a better world.

In September 2015, 193 countries agreed on 17 goals and 169 sub-goals at the United Nations General Assembly. Since the SDGs are designed to end poverty and world hunger, protect the planet and its resources by 2030, they are also called the "2030 Agenda".

The SDGs are universal, meaning they are equally applicable to all countries. They include challenging targets for rich countries as well as poor.





































Stabilise the three pillars

We at L&R agreed on the strategy SUCCESS+2030 where we declared sustainability as a key aspect. With the three pillars Economy, Environment and Social Sphere L&R actively applies the appropriate SDGs of the "Agenda 2030" for its strategic development with the strategy SUCCESS+2030. L&R works together alongside its employees to set an example with regards to sustainability.

All three pillars Economy, Environment and Social Sphere are equally important for L&R to have a long-lasting impact on sustainability. Therefore these aspects should not be seen as separate but connected to each other in terms of the targets and projects. In other words, if one pillar is unstable the whole building will collapse. The different SDGs attempt to balance the three dimensions and are therefore part of the strategy SUCCESS+2030.


End hunger, achieve food security and improved nutrition, and promote sustainable agriculture.

Protect, restore and promote sustainable use of terrestrial ecosystems, sustainably manage forests, combat desertification, and halt and reverse land degradation and halt biodiversity loss.

We used materiality analysis to identify the topics to which we can make a significant contribution through our daily work. Therefore we carried out an internal and external sustainability survey in the summer 2021.
